"Don't shoot the messenger." We hear this message a great deal in life and it is used to inform the hearer that the conveyor of the news is not the originator, just the deliverer. Your success at "staying out of trouble" often depends on the message, the receiver of the message or if you happen to be a preacher. Preachers rarely deliver a message, FROM GOD'S WORD, without offending someone in their audience.

Present day trends to turn away from Biblical preaching to entertainment, gimmicks, paraphrasing scripture, using denominational or non-biblical material (i.e. The Andy Griffith Show) and preaching human doctrine (PHD, sorry if that offends those who feel the term doctor in front of their name makes their preaching special), we have lost sight of the type of preaching that God demands: doctrinal preaching! Biblical authority does NOT reside with men but with Jehovah God because He is the Creator of all, including mankind.

In the gospel accounts of THE Great Commission, Christ commands, authorizes and obligates His followers to proclaim HIS word, (The Message, The Gospel) to every person all over the world. The word "commission" means the act of entrusting, as a charge or a duty. When one teaches or preaches God's Word, they are trusting in The Lord with all their hearts, not leaning upon their own understanding, to acknowledge Him as the GREAT I AM, and, "looking unto Jesus the author and perfecter of *our* faith, who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising shame, and hath sat down at the right hand of the throne of God."

We MUST be reminded of Christ's words in Matt. 16:26 when He states, "For what shall a man be profited, if he shall gain the whole world, and forfeit his life? or what shall a man give in exchange for his life?"

When we (Christians) show something less than a deep concern for the souls of lost men and women, we live in disobedience to the command of the Great Commission.
